# **Division Challenges, Issues & Solutions**

- Membership will be affected by the Level 4 lockdown due to Covid-19, specifically those clubs
  who have members that are averse to online meetings or technology. There may also be a drop
  due to the legacy programme ending in June. The effect of the latter will be more visible in the
  October renewals.
- ALS and DTM under Legacy: The extension for the Club Coaches, Mentors and Sponsors has been well received.
- ACG under Legacy: Some members expressed interest in running the workshops online, others have deferred their workshops to May-June as they would like to do this in person. The latter would also like TI to extend the ACG to June 2021.
- Some clubs participating in the Distinguished Club Programme will struggle to meet the membership requirement of 20 or net growth of 5 members. The District has scheduled workshops on membership building.
- Exciting to see the high intake of clubs embracing the change and learning opportunities associated with online meetings. The Area Directors have advised the meetings are well run and that the members are enjoying the online meetings.
- In response to the high number of clubs (21) transitioning to Online Meetings, the Area Directors would like to create a register of clubs that will open their meetings for members of other clubs to attend. This will enable members who can no longer attend their own club meetings to keep participating in the short term.
- The clubs with 12 or fewer members could really benefit support from Toastmasters of other clubs attending as guest meeting roles. The Area Directors will be encouraging members to attend those clubs one or twice and attend the online meetings once the register is complete.

### Division Events and other newsworthy items

- During the Division G Conference, it was announced that Rose Wyse sponsored a new trophy for Division G. The intention is to award it to a club at the Division G Conference in 2020/2021. The criteria for winning the trophy was discussed informally during this year's conference. Rather than two criteria of 'the club with the most members attend and furthest distance travelled', it is likely to change to one criterion, being 'the club that has the most members attend the conference'. A name for the Trophy will be required too.
